About Indore

Indore is the commercial capital of the state of Madhya Pradesh. It is also known as The City of Holkars. The city was built by a Holkar Rani, Ahilya Bai. The city has historic significance and is one of the major industrial cities in the state. The city is also important for education in the state, as many noteworthy institutions, including the IIM (Indian Institute of Management) and IIT (Indian Institute of Technology) are situated here. The city has many important tourist spots and is an important part of tourism in Madhya Pradesh. It is well-connected by road, rail and air routes. Being close to Rajasthan, Indore has certain climatic peculiarities. During the day, temperature can be as high as 45°C while nights tend to be cool. The nights of Malwa are termed as 'Shab-e-Malwa'. Indore enjoys a moderate rainfall. Rains strike Indore around the third week of June and continue well into September.
